



Jr. Camp Pack List

Linens

- Blanket & Fitted Twin Sheet or a Sleeping bag + a fitted twin sheet
- Pillow – Bath towels – Beach towel - Dirty Laundry bag

Clothing

- Pajamas - Socks – Underwear
- 4-5 Outfits Play cloths and shoes
(Pants only on boys and skirts/dresses only on girls - See dress code below)
- 2 Outfits that can get wet, there will be gender segregated pool time and field water activities

Toiletries

- Toothbrush & toothpaste - Shampoo, conditioner, soap - Comb/brush
- Hygiene products - Shower Shoes

Outdoors

- Hat - Sunscreen - Bug repellent – Flashlight
- Sling Shot – Water Gun – Shoes you can hike in and shoes you can get wet.
(Camp Kellogg can get dusty, white shoes will not stay white for long)

Other

- Prescription Medications (To be given to the Camp Nurse at check in)

Leave At Home

- Electronic Devices - Music - Toys - knives & tools - Nice church cloths

Dress Code Guidelines (Excerpt from Oregon District UPCI Policy)

- There will be no jewelry or make-up allowed during camp.
- All dresses and skirts must be below the knee, with no splits that come above the knee.
- The girls will not be allowed to wear pants, slacks, or shorts (pj's in the cabins are allowed)
- Boys must wear jeans or slacks, no shorts, please.
- Fish-net or see-through type shirts will not be allowed, along with sleeveless shirts or blouses.
- There should be no apparel that immodestly exposes the body.
- Boys' haircuts must be consistent with the presently accepted UPC hair style.
- Facial hair will not be allowed.

In addition, we ask that no fireworks, weapons, tobacco, drugs, or alcohol be brought onto the campground. Anyone who is found to violate this directive will be subject to immediate dismissal.
